

THREE WAYS HEALTH CENTER BOARD MEMBERS CAN SERVE AS AMBASSADORS FOR THE COVID-19 VACCINE

Training Handout

The short video, **Three Ways Health Center Board Members Can Serve as Ambassadors for the COVID-19 Vaccine**, outlines the following key strategies for board members:

- 1. Stay informed about where members of your community can receive the COVID-19 vaccine.
- 2. Build comfort talking about the vaccine and addressing some of the reasons members of your community may be hesitant.
- 3. Know where to point people for accurate, fact-based, and reliable information.

Below are talking points board members can use when talking about the COVID-19 vaccine.

- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) suggests community ambassadors can help build confidence in the vaccine by sharing messages such as:¹
 - You can help stop the pandemic by getting a COVID-19 vaccine.
 - COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective.
 - The COVID-19 vaccine will be free for you.
 - After COVID-19 vaccination, you may have some side effects. These are normal signs that your body is building protection.
 - You will still need to wear a mask and socially distance after getting each shot of the vaccine for now.
- Board members can also address misinformation about the vaccine by sharing key facts such as:²
 - COVID-19 vaccines cannot give you COVID-19.
 - People who have already gotten sick with COVID-19 may still benefit from getting vaccinated.
 - Getting vaccinated can help prevent getting sick with COVID-19.
